2. Pass a standardized test, such as the College Board AP or college placement exam, to receive credit for Latin work completed at Providence Academy
3. Graduate with an appreciation for Latin authors, such as Vergil and Cicero, and their contribution to world literature and culture

The student will:

2. Master Latin grammatical constructions appropriate to each level
3. Improve reading comprehension skills through Latin translation of original and adapted works appropriate to each level
